RULES AND REGULATIONS

for the exhibition titled “CEKE 2026 – Central Europe Knives Exhibition”
(hereinafter referred to as the “Rules and Regulations”)

§ 1

General Provisions

1. These Rules apply to the exhibition titled “CEKE 2026 – Central Europe Knives Exhibition,” taking place on October 17–18, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the PGE Narodowy im. Kazimierza Górskiego venue, located at al. Księcia J. Poniatowskiego 1 in Warsaw (zip code: 03-901)—hereinafter referred to as the “Exhibition.”
2. The organizer of the Exhibition is a foundation named the Foundation for the Support of Polish Crafts and Guild Heritage (address: ul. Feliksa Pancera 9/21, 03-187 Warsaw; court of registration: District Court for the Capital City of Warsaw in Warsaw, 12th Commercial Division of the National Court Register; KRS No.: 0000984457; REGON No.: 522718414; Tax ID (NIP): 5242946924; authorized representative: the Management Board; Articles of Association dated July 13, 2022).
3. The Exhibition will feature cutlery crafts, outdoor gear (clothing and accessories), flashlights, as well as materials and tools for the artisanal production of the items listed herein. These Rules and Regulations define the rights and obligations of the Organizer, the conditions for participation, and the rules of conduct for Exhibition participants, including, in particular, provisions governing:
 - A) the manner in which the Exhibition is organized,
 - B) the conditions for participation in the Exhibition,
 - C) the rights of Exhibition participants,
 - D) the obligations of Exhibition participants,
 - E) the rules regarding the liability of Exhibition participants for conduct inconsistent with these Rules and Regulations,
 - F) the rules regarding the liability of Exhibition participants for conduct inconsistent with generally applicable law.

§ 2

Organization

1. The Organizer is responsible for safety at the venue and throughout the duration of the Exhibition.
2. Admission to the Exhibition is subject to a fee. Tickets will be sold at the ticket office on the day of the Exhibition or online at the following website: www.eventim.pl/artist/centraleuropeknivesexhibition.
3. The ticket price list will be available at the ticket office on the day of the Exhibition, as well as at the website indicated in the preceding clause of this paragraph.
4. Exhibition participants who pay for admission will receive a ticket and an ID badge (in the form of a wristband). Purchasing an admission ticket grants access to the Exhibition exclusively on the day it is held (depending on whether the participant purchased a one-day or two-day ticket).

5. The ticket and wristband are reusable. This means that a single payment for admission allows you to move freely between the Exhibition grounds and other areas. However, re-entry to the Exhibition is contingent upon presenting the previously issued wristband.
6. Persons under the age of 14 may enter the Exhibition free of charge, accompanied by an adult guardian who has purchased a ticket, subject to the provisions of § 2, section 9, point K). The Organizer may request proof of the participant's age (e.g., by presenting a student ID or an ID card).
7. The Organizer (its employees, service providers, contractors, etc.) has the right to temporarily suspend admission to the Exhibition if the maximum number of visitors is exceeded. The Organizer shall inform potential visitors of such a situation, and they shall decide whether to wait until admission capacity is restored. The maximum number of participants is determined by the Organizer in accordance with generally applicable laws.
8. Participants must leave their outerwear (coats, jackets, hats, scarves, gloves, neck warmers, etc.) in the coat check; they may also leave luggage, bags, purses, backpacks, pouches, suitcases, helmets, headwear, umbrellas, etc., in the coat check.
9. Admission to the Exhibition is prohibited for any person:
 - A) against whom a ruling has been issued prohibiting admission to a mass event or requiring them to refrain from being present at venues where mass events are held,
 - B) against whom a public-law ban on participating in sporting, cultural, educational, and similar events has been issued, or against whom a foreign ban has been issued,
 - C) who refuse to have their eligibility to attend the Exhibition verified (ticket or ID badge) or to submit to identity verification by the Organizer for the purpose of establishing their identity,
 - D) who refuses to allow the contents of their luggage (bags, purses, backpacks, pouches, suitcases, etc.) and clothing to be inspected if there is suspicion that the person is carrying or possesses weapons, dangerous objects, explosives, pyrotechnic devices, flammable materials, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or psychotropic substances,
 - E) who is under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, psychotropic substances, strongly stimulating medications, or other substances with similar effects,
 - F) behaving in an aggressive, provocative, or confrontational manner, or otherwise posing a threat to public safety or order and to the Exhibition itself,
 - G) possessing a weapon (e.g., a firearm) or other dangerous objects, materials, products, beverages, agents, or substances (especially corrosive or flammable ones),
 - H) wearing shoes with metal tips,
 - I) attempting to bring in food or bottled beverages not secured with a tight-fitting cap,
 - J) whose appearance prevents full and unambiguous identification,
 - K) a minor not accompanied by an adult (minimum age requirement of 18 years).
10. The Organizer has the final say regarding a specific participant's admission to the Exhibition and the possibility of bringing in certain items.
11. Admission to the Exhibition shall take place in compliance with generally applicable laws.

§ 3

Terms of Participation

1. During the Exhibition, the following are specifically prohibited:

- A) wearing clothing or items intended to cover the face or to prevent or hinder identification—unless other guidelines are mandated by law, e.g., in connection with the declaration of a state of epidemic or pandemic,
- B) proclaiming or displaying slogans containing obscene, offensive, vulgar, provocative, confrontational, or racist content,
- C) inciting strife based on nationality, religion, social status, worldview, origin, etc., as well as encouraging other Exhibition participants to express such content, including by shouting slogans,
- D) throwing any objects,
- E) possessing and consuming alcohol,
- F) consuming (smoking) tobacco products or similar items,
- G) using intoxicants or psychotropic substances,
- H) starting and fanning fires,
- I) possessing explosives, pyrotechnic devices, and other substances with similar effects,
- J) littering the premises, as well as damaging the facility's small and large infrastructure,
- K) occupying spaces in passageways and on evacuation routes,
- L) using the facility's equipment in a manner inconsistent with its intended purpose,
- M) using physical violence or making threats against other attendees.

2. It is prohibited to bring the following into the Exhibition:

- A) animals (however, this does not apply to guide dogs—their handlers are responsible for the dogs' comfort and safety, as well as for the dogs' behavior),
- B) weapons, ammunition, and other dangerous objects,
- C) explosives, pyrotechnic devices, and substances with similar effects, as well as any type of flammable materials,
- D) containers for liquids or products, including food items—in justified cases, the Organizer may grant permission to bring in the items referred to in this section (e.g., if a participant needs to take medication on time),
- E) narcotics, psychotropic substances, highly stimulating medications, or other substances with similar effects,
- F) helmets and umbrellas (must be left in the coat check),
- G) scooters and bicycles,
- H) alcoholic beverages,
- I) materials containing racist, offensive, political, xenophobic, confrontational, provocative, or vulgar content,
- J) containers for spraying gas, corrosive substances, or dyes,

K) laser pointers,

L) advertising materials (except those approved by the Organizer).

3. The Organizer reserves the right to refuse permission to bring in video cameras, still cameras, and other similar devices that record sound or video, as well as devices used to transmit video, audio, or event commentary over the Internet for commercial purposes.

4. The Organizer reserves the right to refuse permission to bring in an item if there is reasonable suspicion that it may be used to commit a prohibited act, as defined by generally applicable law or these Rules and Regulations.

5. It is prohibited to enter areas not designated for participants (spectators). This prohibition applies in particular to equipment not intended for general use, the building's facade, fences, walls, barriers, the building's roofs, lighting fixtures, masts of any kind, and entry into other areas, facilities, and rooms to which only specialized services or representatives of the Organizer have access.

6. Complicity and aiding and abetting in acts that are prohibited in accordance with the above provisions, the facility's rules and regulations, or directly by generally applicable law, shall also be treated as a violation of these Rules and Regulations, providing grounds for denial of admission to the Exhibition or a demand to leave the premises.

§ 4

Participant Obligations

1. Exhibitors are required to:

A) carry personal protective equipment—if required by generally applicable law on the day of the Exhibition,

B) undergo temperature screening and other measures resulting from the declared state of epidemic—if required by generally applicable law on the day of the Exhibition,

C) not to infringe upon the personal space of others or disturb public order,

D) comply with these Rules and Regulations and the facility's rules and regulations,

E) carry and present, upon request by the Organizer's security or information staff, a document authorizing entry to and presence at the Exhibition (ticket and ID badge), as well as a valid identification document (e.g., ID card or passport),

F) not endanger the safety of other participants,
